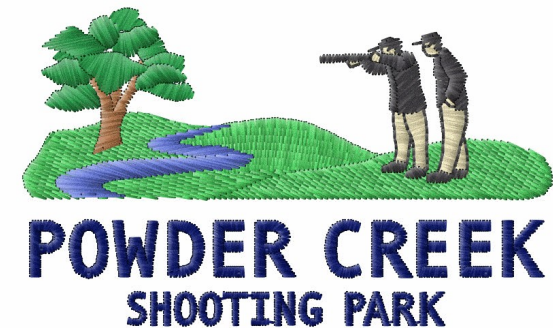

### General:

The total number of shooters registered by the start date determines the size of each team. Teams will not exceed five members.

Each person will shoot 50 targets per week for 9 weeks.

Entry fee is \$30.00 per team member.

The cost of targets is current club price per 25 to be paid when shot.

### Awards:

Awards will be CASH given for the 1<sup>st</sup>, 4<sup>th</sup> and 7<sup>th</sup> place teams. There will also be an award for HIGH AVERAGE and MOST IMPROVED SHOOTER. *NOTE: To be eligible for the HIGH AVERAGE award, you must shoot at least 7 of 9 weeks.*

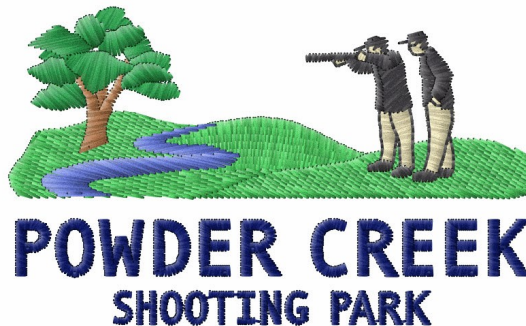
### This is a Handicap System which works as follows for each 50 targets shot:

The 50-target total is divided by 2 for your AVERAGE. Example: 20 and 21 = 41 targets shot. Divide 41 by 2 and your average is 20.5 for each round the first week. Each week thereafter, the 50 targets are added to the total targets and divided by the number of total rounds shot to determine your average for the week.

### Handicap System – continued:

If your Average is:	You get these added breaks to your score:
0 to 10.50.....	9.8
10.51 to 11.50.....	9.1
11.51 to 12.50.....	8.4
12.51 to 13.50.....	7.7
13.51 to 14.50.....	7.0
14.51 to 15.50.....	6.3
15.51 to 16.50.....	5.6
16.51 to 17.50.....	4.9
17.51 to 18.50.....	4.2
18.51 to 19.50.....	3.5
19.51 to 20.50.....	2.8
20.51 to 21.50.....	2.1
21.51 to 22.50.....	1.4
22.51 to 23.50*.....	.7
*must shoot doubles or 410	
23.51 to 25.00*.....	0
*must shoot doubles or 410	

\* Anyone who has an average of 22.51 or better must shoot either doubles all stations or 410 gauge the next week. You cannot handicap to 25, it must be a natural 25. You can only handicap to 24.



### League Standing:

League Standing will be determined on the Point System. Two points for each round won on a team basis PLUS 1 point for “Total Natural Targets Broken.” TOTAL OF 5 POINTS available to win each week. In the event of a tie, points will be split.

For those of you who are analytical, here’s how it works. You shoot 2 rounds, take the total score and divide by 2...that’s your average. Look at the chart above to identify what handicap the average receives. Then add the handicap to each round of targets broken...ditto procedure for your partners. Finally, add your team’s handicap scores (per individual round) together and compare it to the opposing team(s). This gets you the first 2 points...then you do the same for the second round and that gets you the second 2 points. Total actual targets broken gets the final 1 point. For a total of 5 points each week.

### Shooting Deadlines:

Team members need not shoot together (although it is more fun that way), however, the week’s competition has to be shot before the Club closes at 10:00 p.m. on Tuesday. League targets can be shot in advance.

### Absentees:

If one of the members of a team is unable to shoot a particular week, he/she will receive a “blind score” for that week. A “blind score” is the absent team member’s average less 2 targets plus his handicap. Absentees will shoot doubles or 410 ga on the following week.
